Through the coordination of public and political support, the Restriction of Ribbon Development Act of 1935 protected views of the countryside from the encroachments of suburbia. National Parks Wordsworths 1810 description of the Lakes as a sort of national property culminated in CPREs long campaign for National Parks, which in turn was inspired by the worlds first National Parks like Yellowstone in 1874.
